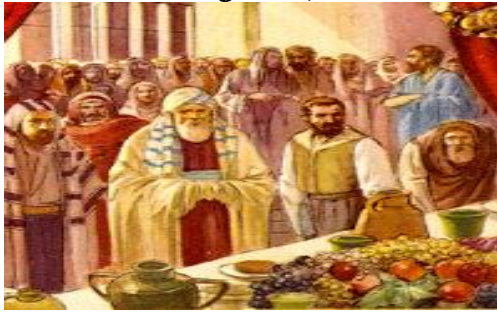

**SUNDAY READINGS**

**First Reading:** Isaiah 62: 1-5

**Psalms 96:** Declare the marvellous works of the Lord among all the peoples.

**Second Reading:** Corinthians 12: 4-11

**Gospel:** John 2: 1-12

**REFLECTION**

The second reading provides a powerful call to each of us in our own uniqueness. No one of us, no marriage or family, no single set of relationships, has all the gifts God has for us. So go, and “do whatever he tells

you,” in the hope of building up people, families, and communities who can be signs of love for the world.

In today’s Gospel you will hear that it makes a difference that we follow Jesus. He works miracles for us ~ increased joy, new life, healing, peace, renewed possibility. At the end of the miracle at the wedding at Cana, the reading says that God’s glory was revealed and people believed in Jesus. So, why do you believe? What difference does your faith make? When was the last time you told anyone about what God is doing for and in you? It’s okay that you resist this – even Jesus had to be convinced by Mary to share His gift. But God’s way requires that we who have met Him introduce Him to others. Get in touch with the miracles He’s worked in your life, and then, having received them, share them with whoever needs a miracle.

**ARCHDIOCESE  
VATICAN CITY ~ SYNOD ON  
SYNODALITY**

Pope Francis addressed leaders of the French Catholic Action movement during an audience at the Vatican Jan. 13, 2022. The Pope told the group that the synodal process is a path of engagement that makes room for the Holy Spirit, and not a "majority consensus like a parliament."

The synodal is two-year global processes of listening to the faithful that will help the Church reflect on how we can do God’s will in the world today. On January 3, 2022, the provincial government announced that Ontario will be moving to a modified Step 2 of the roadmap to reopening. Capacity restrictions for places of worship are set at 50% capacity, *however* our parish continues to remain a 30% capacity in order to maintain 2 metres between those not from the same family.
