Today marks the beginning of Holy Week ~ the most important and solemn week of the Church's liturgical calendar. From the proclamation of the Gospel at the beginning of the liturgy, we know that today is different, not only because we hear two Gospel passages, or because we hold palms and have them blessed. Though Palm Sunday begins full of hope and joy, each successive weekday brings increasing pain. As we journey with the Lord through that pain, we try to look beyond it to find confidence, trust, acceptance, and ultimately hope, even in the silence of Good Friday and Holy Saturday. It takes a week, and a lifetime, to truly hear the message of

Christ's love. It is difficult for us to comprehend that Jesus willingly sacrificed himself, so we must hear the story again and again.

May the time you spend in the company of the Lord this Holy Week enable you to experience this movement from the pain of His Passion to the hope of His Resurrection.

**PASCHAL FAST:** The Faithful are reminded that the paschal fast should be **observed everywhere on Good Friday and continued, where possible, on Holy Saturday.**
